Early national meetings focused on the development of pharmacoepidemiology as a discipline, and the identification and evaluation of data sources

#### 1995-1996

CAPT-ACTP was formally established as an association in Saskatoon in 1996

#### 1997-1998

The inaugural CAPT-ACTP Board election was conducted, and the By-Laws were finalized

#### 1998-2003

CAPT-ACPT held a series of meetings across Canada to engage stakeholders and build a thriving CAPT-ACTP community

#### 2004-2008

CAPT-ACTP joined with the Canadian Society for Clinical Pharmacology, as well as the Canadian College of Clinical Pharmacy, to hold a Canadian Therapeutics Congress

#### 2009

Beginning in 2009, CAPT-ACTP returned to hosting our in-person annual conferences independently

#### 2020

For the first time in our history, CAPT-ACTP transitioned our annual conference to a virtual platform
