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




Classic definition of value-based healthcare

Value-based care

Strategy that maximizes the value for patients by achieving the best outcomes at the lowest cost; value is defined as the health outcomes achieved per dollar spent.

Value-based pricing

A pricing strategy which sets prices primarily, but not exclusively, based on the perceived or estimated value of a solution to a customer rather than the cost of the product or historical prices.

Value-based contracts

Sometimes referred to as value-based agreements, risk-sharing or outcomes-based contract, VBCs are contract models under which a manufacturer gets paid from providers or payers for the outcomes or values its solutions produce, rather than the volume of the solutions being used.

Value-based payment

Form of reimbursement that ties payments for care delivery to the quality of care provided and rewards providers for both efficiency and effectiveness. Emerged as an alternative and potential replacement for the traditional fee-for-serve reimbursement.
